SAFETY AND SECURITY POLICY

The safety and security of members, visitors to the area and residents is, and will continue to be, a priority for Business South Bank.

Business South Bank is committed to working with the relevant bodies and stakeholders to ensure the South Bank Precinct remains a safe and pleasant environment to work, visit and reside.

Our Actions

To achieve this we will:

- Continue to meet with the police on a monthly basis
- Continue to offer personal safety information sessions to members
- Continue to liaise with and lobby all government agencies that have a direct involvement with security matters, these agencies include but are not limited to Queensland Police Service, Queensland Rail, Brisbane City Council, Translink and South Bank Corporation.
- Continue to lobby Queensland Rail for improved security at both the South Bank and South Brisbane train stations.
- Encourage members to develop their own Safety and Security Policies within their organisations
- Encourage members to install security cameras and where possible, have these cameras linked to South Bank Corporation who in turn can link to QLD Police central command.
- Work with and support community organisations that assist the disadvantaged in our community, and encourage our members to participate in local initiatives.
- Encourage members with liquor licences to be exemplary in their House Policies when dealing with disorderly people.
- Support and encourage participation in the police truancy program
- Conduct future safety audits of problem areas.
- Monitor results of safety audits to ensure recommendations are implemented.
